War won, Zero Casualties

NOROLK, VA – Teens With a Purpose (TWP) fights everyday to save lives one teen at a time. Their daily battle is combating impediments that Teens face from HIV/STDs, Dating Violence, Distracted Teen Driving, and Bullying. TWP's goal is zero casualties in the war to rescue local teens. In order to continue their work, they seek the support of the community. A sponsorship Launch Party, which captured the whole-hearted support of television personality - Al Roker of NBC's Today Show, was held on May 24th at the Westin Town Center Hotel. The Launch Party gave potential corporate sponsors, donors and supporters an opportunity to learn about this local community organization, meet board members, current supporters and the Teens that make-up the organization. Key community, business and political leaders gathered for the purpose of kicking-off Teens With a Purpose 2012 fundraising campaign, which will include the 2012 TWP Gala and Silent Auction featuring Al Roker on November 9th, 2012 at the Westin and the 15th Annual Teen Event: No Holding Back on November 10th, 2012 at the Crispus Attucks Theatre. The Launch Party program included the introduction of two new Board Members – Regional Vice President of GEICO, Joe Thomas and Former Executive Director of the Boys & Girls Club, John Mack. Due to the growth of the organization, in 2012 TWP formed an Executive Advisory Council which consists of key business, education, and community leaders including Teri Rigell, Vice President of Freedom Automotive and wife of Congressman Scott Rigell.

In attendance, were Regional Vice President of GEICO, Joseph Thomas, Anchor for WAVY-TV & FOX-43, Nicole Livas, Congressman Bobby Scott, Virginia Beach School Board representative, Patrick Sayler and many other notable business, community, and civic leaders. Supporters spoke and encouraged guests to donate to the local organization. Al Roker, who is also a board member and advocate of Teens With a Purpose, encouraged guests to support the organization and the need for TWP, "Helping disenfranchised youth, is really part of the mission here, and I think even if you don't have kids or don't know Teens that have issues, eventually they become all of our issues, so I think it's really important." This is Rokers' second visit to Hampton Roads this year, in January he thanked all the TWP donors, supporters and partners at the TWP Donor Recognition Luncheon held in Norfolk. One of TWPs main sponsors is GEICO, earlier this year Teens With a Purpose joined their Distracted Teen Driving Campaign alongside Drive Smart Virginia and WAVY/TV. The campaign invited every high school in Hampton Roads to participate and pledge to Wait-to Text. Nineteen schools answered the call and Lake Taylor High School won a GEICO sponsored pep rally for the entire student body with live music by Teens With a Purpose, food and prices by GEICO and news coverage by WAVY.

Teens With a Purpose members Robert Johnson, Gabrielle Brinkley and Richard A. Love performed at the Launch Party. Richard Love performed 'Road Time', a song written specifically by Love for the Distracted Driving campaign with GEICO and Drive Smart. Paige Robinson, 22, talked about being a member since the age of 13, the important role that TWP played in her life, and how the organization helped her deal with having a Mother who is infected with HIV. Paige left the organization for about a year, but felt the internal yearning to come back to help people at the place she called "home."

"Teens with a Purpose" was developed in 1996 with a mission to promote abstinence and help build self-esteem through innovative programs for teens in the Hampton Roads area. Throughout the year, TWP hosts numerous events and seminars to provide HIV/STD prevention information and focus on preventing gang violence, dating abuse, teen pregnancy, distracted teen driving and other life-changing issues. "We want to continue to provide young people with a platform to empower one another while using their voices, energy and talents to effect personal change. Utilizing the arts, peer-led programs and community events allows them to assist in improving the lives of others and foster a more knowledgeable community. All while in a nonjudgmental safe environment," states Deirdre A. Love, Founder and Executive Director of Teens With a Purpose.
